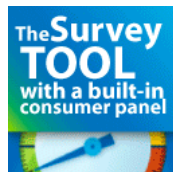
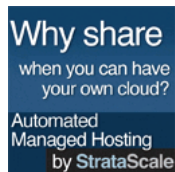
Skyfire acquires Kolbysoft, developers of the popular Steel browser for Android
